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Working With Parents

PARENTS ARE WELCOMED AND VALUED AT Ashmole Primary. We would like to work in partnership to develop mutual support, encouragement and consultation as we believe that a child will work more successfully when home and school share the same aims.

The Head Teacher and Deputy are available to discuss any issues with regard to your child or the school in general. Parents are always welcome to talk to class teachers.

Attendance

Regular and punctual attendance are extremely important in order for your child to gain full benefit from all the experiences of Ashmole Primary school. However, if your child is unwell we ask that you telephone the school before 10 am on the first day of absence to explain the reason. A letter confirming this should be sent with your child when they return to school.

The school will not authorise holidays in term time.

Welfare

We have qualified first aiders who act as the first point of contact for any pupil who requires medical attention during the school day.

Uniform

Ashmole Primary is a uniform wearing school. Uniform will be available to be purchased from the school uniform supplier during July/August in school or through the school office.

Behaviour

We aim to create a secure calm and caring environment in which all children can thrive. Everyone has the right to feel happy and secure at Ashmole Primary. The ethos of the school is founded on the relationships of all who work and learn here.

We regard all adults as role models and have high expectations of the children's behaviour. We expect all members of the school to treat each other with respect. Children, parents and staff must have a clear understanding of what is unacceptable and know that this will be dealt with in a consistent manner. We aim to develop in partnership and hope that parents recognise this shared responsibility.

Homework

All children will be given work to do at home in order to practise aspects of their learning. The amount of homework will increase as your child progresses through the school. It is important for parents to enable children to regularly read at home, preferably every day.

Extra Curricular Activities

Initially this will include a Breakfast club, After school club and football

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The Curriculum



SHMOLE PRIMARY WILL PROVIDE A BROAD, Abalanced and creative curriculum, compliant with the National Curriculum. A wide range of subjects will be taught focusing on the development of knowledge, understanding and skills, with a strong emphasis on the core subjects of English, Mathematics and Science and designed to ensure that pupils of all abilities will excel. A curriculum where pupils develop knowledge, understanding and skills through the teaching of English, Mathematics, Science, Computing, RE, PSHE, Geography, History, Music, Art, Design & Technology, Spanish and Physical Education will be taught, where relevant links will be made between subjects. There will be daily lessons in English and Mathematics. The use of ICT/Computing will be incorporated across the curriculum and the whole

school curriculum will be underpinned by social, moral, spiritual and cultural education, with a values based and inclusive approach. There will be the highest expectations for the behaviour and safety of the pupils at Ashmole Primary. The highest emphasis will be placed on the acquisition of the key skills of reading, writing and oral communication in literacy, which will be evidenced through pupils' work across all curriculum areas. In addition the teaching of Mathematics will focus on age appropriate mathematical knowledge as a starting point, with high expectations for a level of mastery in each year group and an application of mathematical skills acorss the curriculum. The Early Years Foundation Stage (Reception) will follow the EYFS curriculum with a planned transition into Year 1 where pupils will progress

on to the National Curriculum. The work children undertake will be planned by the class teacher according to the school schemes of work; prepared by subject leaders. Pupils will therefore be provided with a curriculum that will enable them to gain the essential knowledge they need to become educated citizens. There will be a daily act of collective worship.

At Key Stage 2 there will be increasingly more specialist subject teaching particuarly in those areas which my be less well taught by nonspecialists for example, Science PE, Music and Spanish. Spanish has been chosen as the language to teach from Year 3 as that is the main language as Ashmole Primary. Pupils will also be exposed to the teaching of Spanish in Key Stage 1 through weekly short lessons. The mastering of Spanish will provide a good basis to learn other languages later. At Ashmole Academy, from Year 8 onwards German and French are taught as well as Spanish.

Ashmole Primary will have excellent grounds for sporting use and the development of sporting talent. Sport coaches and trained PE teachers will work with the primary school from Reception teaching lessons, running after school clubs and running competitive sports. The school will have access to all the sporting facilities of the Academy and can become the primary school sporting hub for all the schools in the area which may lack those facilities. The primary school will be a specialist centre for the teaching of Music at primary education

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Admissions Criteria

Ashmole Primary is a Free School primary school which will cater for children aged between 4 and 11 years.

The school will admit 60 children to reception commencing September 2016. For entry in 2016 Ashmole Primary will not appear on the eAdmissions website. To apply for the school, please contact the Admissions Co-ordinator or download an application form from the school website. The deadline for applications will be 15th January 2016.

Oversubscription Criteria

The admissions arrangements provide that when applications exceed the number of places available, places will be offered in accordance to the following criteria, after the admission of pupils with an Education, Health and Care Plan naming the school.

- a. Children who are 'looked after' under provision of Section 22(1) of the Children Act 1989. This includes those children who have previously been looked after but immediately after being looked after became subject to adoption, a child arrangements order, or special guardianship order.
- b. Children who have a sibling at Ashmole Primary School at the time at which the application for admission to the school is made.*
- c. Sons and daughters of staff where the person has been recruited to fill a vacant post for which there is a demonstrable skill shortage.

d. Proximity to the school. This will be measured by the straight line distance by the Local Authority using a GIS computerised mapping system, from Ashmole Primary Head Teacher's office to the applicant's home, those living nearest to Ashmole Primary School having the highest priority. **

Tie Breaker

If two or more children are tied for the final available place we will prioritise the child who lives closest to the Head Teacher's office. This will be measured by the straight line distance by the Local Authority using a GIS computerised mapping system, from Ashmole Primary Head Teacher's office to the applicant's home **

If it is necessary to apply a further tie-break, in the event that two or more children live at the same distance from the school, the tie breaker will be random allocation, where the supervised drawing of lots by an independent responsible person of good standing will be used to decide which child(ren) will be allocated the remaining place(s).

If children of multiple births (twins and triplets) are tied for the final place; the tie-breakers will not apply to them. Those siblings will be admitted over PAN as permitted by infant class size rules.

Method of Applications for Reception

Applications for a Reception place to be made through the London Borough of Barnet through the online process. No additional forms are required by the school. On national offer day, if in the case of the funding agreement not being in place, conditional offers will be made to parents alongside a firm offer from the Local Authority.

Date of Admission/Deferred Entry

Children will normally be admitted to the reception year in the September following their fourth birthday.


In line with the Admissions Code, parents can defer their child's entry to the reception year until later in the school year, where they have been offered a place at a school to start before they are of compulsory school age. Where entry is deferred, the school will hold the place for that child and not offer it to another child. However, entry cannot be deferred beyond the beginning of the term after the child's fifth birthday, nor beyond the beginning of the final term of the Reception Year. Children can also attend part-time until they reach compulsory school age. ***

Admission of children outside their normal age group

Children will normally be admitted to the reception year in the September following their fourth birthday and the vast majority of pupils are educated within their normal chronological age group. Any request for admission outside of the child's chronological year of entry will be considered in accordance with paragraphs 2.17-2.17B of the Admissions Code. Such requests would normally apply to children that are summer born and there are significant reasons that would benefit the child's academic, social and emotional

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development by starting Reception in the following year as opposed to Year 1.

The school's governing committee will consider requests on the circumstances of each case and in the best interests of the child concerned. This will include taking account of the parent's views; information about the child's academic, social and emotional development; where relevant, their medical history and the views of a medical

professional; whether they have previously been educated out of their normal age group; and whether they may naturally have fallen into a lower age group if it were not for being born prematurely. The Head Teacher's views will also be taken into account. Each case must be supported by a letter from a professional (e.g. GP, Hospital Consultant, Social Worker) that provides the reasons for admissions outside of


the chronological year group. If the request is approved, the application will then be considered in accordance with the school's oversubscription criteria in the event of oversubscription.

Parents have a statutory right to appeal against the refusal of a place at the school but this right does not apply if they are offered a place at the school but it is not in their preferred age group.

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
