This has been a very busy and exciting new term for our children at school. We have many clubs running after school which are a great experience for our children. We will be monitoring the pupils' progress in Spanish by the end of the year and plan to host a Spanish themed day in the summer term. <u>Spanish</u>

The Reception children have been very receptive to learning a new language. The children have quickly picked up basic simple words and started using them outside of their Spanish lessons. The children are gaining a great sense of accomplishment from learning to speak some words in Spanish. The pupils have worked with enthusiasm and they will certainly build on their own understanding and knowledge over the year ahead.

Some of our Spanish Spring Term Targets include:

- To recognise the names of 5 Spanish animals.
- To identify different Spanish colours.
- To sing the "Animals song".
- To use Spanish numbers to count animals.
- To use Spanish colours to talk about animals.
- To group Spanish animals into pets and farm animals.
- To use adjectives to give sizes of animals.
- To colour in animals by listening to the different colours in Spanish.
- To understand key parts of a Spanish story.
- To describe an animal and say its colour in Spanish.

After School Clubs

Not only are our clubs a great help for our working parents, they are also an important part of the development of our school community. Most importantly, these clubs give our children the opportunity to experience different activities and to enhance their own skills outside of the school curriculum.

Tennis Club

Tennis Club takes place after school every Monday and Thursday and is led by Paul Rock. This session is not only a great introduction to tennis for children, but also teaches them fundamental hand-eye coordination, flexibility, balance, and ball skills. Basic technical training and footwork will also be developed through fun games, which vary weekly to maximise every child's development.

Football Club

Football is held every Tuesday after school and is run by Soccer Revolution. Led by Stelios Ekkeshis and with over 15 years experience, Stelios's focus is on ensuring children learn, develop and have fun at the same time.

Drama Club

Drama Club, led by Stage Coach, takes place on Fridays after school. Stage Coach's emphasis is on raising confidence and self-esteem, trying new things and working with the children to create a different story each week. Most importantly, they promote training for the biggest stage your child will encounter; life!

Art Club

Art Club takes place after school every Wednesday, for ten pupils only. These ten pupils have been chosen as they have shown a keen interest in Creative Arts. We know that lots of children would like to take part in this but due to space, the class teachers could only pick a handful of children for this activity this time round.
