Year 3

It's been a fantastic start to the year in Year 3. We are thoroughly enjoying getting to know our new classes and discovering the talents of each pupil. We've started the Autumn term with Ancient Greece as our topic and the children have been acquainting themselves with all the characters in Ancient Greek myths - as well as writing their own Greek myths in Literacy. Furthermore, we have been learning how to expand our sentences and develop our figurative language skills to help our descriptive writing. In Maths we have been revising Place Value and will soon be moving on to Addition and Subtraction in the coming weeks. In Science we are learning about Plants and Flowers - their functions and how they grow. Our P.E. lessons are on Monday and Tuesday, and as a reminder please remember that we would like children to come into school with their school uniforms on P.E. days. In R.E. we are learning about Christianity and how its beliefs hold similarities with other religions while in PSHE we have been looking at why we need rules (not too many) in a healthy society.

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Year 4

In Cosmo and Apollo Class, we have been learning about our new topics which we have enjoyed! In history, we have been looking at the Roman Empire, where we have been having debates about whether Claudius should invade Britain, learning about what life was like for a Roman soldier and learning about what the Romans did for entertainment. We have also had African drumming this term, which we have all enjoyed learning how to play the drum, alongside some songs that we can sing along to as we play. We have enjoyed exploring the outside environment, looking at our natural world and observing leaves. We made some predictions about how we think the leaves will change as the seasons change. We worked on labelling the leaves using keywords such as; petiole, midrib and veins. In science, we have then moved onto looking at the different properties of solids and liquids and how these properties change, and how some properties of a liquid can be used for a solid, such as sand, which we have enjoyed debating about. In literacy, we have been looking at different fables. We have particularly enjoyed acting out our own fables, writing group fables and planning and writing our own fables based on a moral. We looked carefully at our work to ensure that we included all of the different literacy features. Well done for all your hard work Year 4! (:)

All donations can be brought to the school office on <u>Monday 10th October at 3pm</u> where I will be to collect them.


