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# Year 3

October has been a fantastic month for Year 3. This week we celebrated all our learning on our topic of 'Greece Now and Then' with a WOW Ancient Greek Day. The children looked amazing in their costumes and they participated in lots of different activities during the course of the day. The highlight was the re-enactment of the famous Battle of Marathon really brought the children's learning to life. Recently, in Literacy the children enjoyed acting out the story of Perseus and Medusa and had the opportunity to develop their journalistic skills by writing some amazing newspaper articles about the story. In maths they have been learning about addition and subtraction using the column method as well as different mental strategies. In science the children have been learning about how to carry out fair tests and how water moves through plants as well as the functions of the different parts of the plants. In art, we have been looking at the designs and patterns on Greek pots and we finally made our own out of clay!

## Year 4

In Cosmo and Apollo class we have had a great first half term, full of lots of fun activities! In Science, we have been looking at states of matter and have been conducting different experiments to observe the different properties of solids, liquids and gases and how they change. Experiments included melting ice cubes in different temperatures, weighing air using balloons as well as dropping raisins into lemonade and observing what happens! As well as this, in Literacy we have been learning about many different influential people as part of Black History Month, such as Rosa Parks, Nelson Mandela, Ghandi, Martin Luther King and many more. We have created our own 'I have a dream' speeches on subjects we felt passionate about. Topics included: stopping animal testing, saving the trees on our planet, say no to plastic and many more. In history we have been learning all about the Romans and what they did. We have linked this to our D&T lessons as we have created a moving book all about the Romans using levers and sliders. The books included information about what Roman soldiers did, what Roman life was like and what Roman life was like for children. All the books came out superbly! PE has been another subject where we have been able to express our creative side, we have been creating a sequence of dance moves as if we were astronauts. We incorporated slow movements and actions as well as using lots of different elevated steps. Well done everybody, you all made fantastic astronauts. Super well done for all your hard work so far Year 4!

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## Year 5

We have also been impressed with how they have all challenged themselves and worked on really tricky word problems. In Literacy, we have really enjoyed reading Brian Selznick's 'Wonderstruck.' We have been reading as a class and predicting how the intertwining stories and pictures are linked. We have also written fantastic newspaper reports based on the 'True Story of the Three Little Pigs.' The children planned witty headlines, excellent key details and rhetorical questions. We look forward to sharing these with you at the next parents' evening.

The children have worked extremely hard and deserve a well-rested break. Have a lovely half term!

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


#### <u>Bike Raffle</u>
