### Reception

What a great start to the new year we've had in Reception!

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In Phonics, we have nearly learnt all of our phase 3 sounds and tricky words. We have started writing an 'I can see' sentence each morning when we come in to the classroom. The children are becoming superstars at beginning to use these sounds independently in their reading and their writing. In Maths, we explored addition and subtraction and enjoyed using resources to write number sentences. We are now beginning to explore length and have been using measuring worms, cubes and rulers to find out how long or short an object is. This term, our topic is 'food'. We have been learning about how to live a healthy lifestyle and about the different food groups! Well done Orion and Calypso for having a great start back to the new year! 🙂



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### Year 1

It has been another eventful term here in Year One! We had our fabulous Victorian Day, where the children enjoyed immersing themselves into everyday Victorian school children. We have not stopped there! The children have become little historians delving deeper into the life of a Victorian child. They have learnt all about the way the houses, kitchen and toys were and compared them to our modern-day equivalents. We are very excited to show you our Victorian assembly showcasing what the children have learnt.

In Literacy we have created our own class poems all about jelly and then used our senses to create poems about the seaside. In Maths we have been working very hard on addition and subtraction, including multiples and doubles.

We have also ventured outside looking at our natural habitat in the winter, the children had great fun comparing the creatures in the summer months to those now in the winter.

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### Year 2

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It seems like an age since we last caught up with all the goings on in Year 2! January has been an absolutely fantastic month, and we were so impressed with how all the children settled back into school life after the Christmas break. Well done to them all! The children were not the only ones adjusting to school life in January, as Mrs Pavlakos re-joins the school from maternity leave. She has found her stride straight away and has loved being back.

We have started our topic of Dazzling Dinosaurs and the children have been so excited by this theme!

In Literacy they have researched different dinosaurs and used their notes to write some incredible non-chronological reports about a wide range of dinosaurs.

In Art they have produced some outstanding pop art/Andy Warhol themed pieces using repeating patterns of fossils with eye-catching coloured backgrounds.

In Maths we have made excellent progress in our new topic of multiplication and division. The children are getting to grips with the inverse relationship between the two operations brilliantly.

And last but by no means least, music lessons have been transformed by the effervescent presence of Mrs. Pocock who is teaching the children to play the Glockenspiel. The sound on a Friday morning is quite simply symphony-esque....

### Year 3

Year 3 have had a fantastic start to 2023!

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In literacy we have been learning about instructions and we made our own delicious sandwiches. We also read lots of books by Anthony Browne and wrote some amazing persuasive letters and book reviews. At the moment we are reading 'The Stone Age Boy' which links to our topic of the Stone Age and we are going to write a description of the cave in the story as well as a diary entry. We have been looking at cave drawings in Art and we used a variety of resources to recreate our own. In Maths we have been learning about measurement and we have using rulers and trundle wheels to measure cms and metres. In Science, we have been learning all about healthy eating and our bodies. We have been designing our own balanced meals and discussing the affect it has on our bodies.

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### Year 4

This term has been incredibly fun for Year 4. We have been learning about the Tudors across many of our subjects. In Art we have been looking at King Henry VIII and the portraits that have been painted of him. We have been learning lots of new techniques such as looking at shape, tone and dimension. We have focused on features and how to add detail to them. We have enjoyed looking at how the classes were split in Tudor England through the foods, clothing, housing and education that people received. We have also enjoyed looking at what kind of character King Henry VIII was.

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In Literacy we have also been look at adventure stories. We have enjoyed thinking about the reasons why Arthur should and should not go to the land of the Minimoys, where we created a conscious alley to try and persuade for and against. We have then been creating our own endings, which we have really enjoyed, thinking about and incorporating the different literacy features that are included within adventure stories.

In Science we have been learning all about our digestive system and how it works. For one of our exciting activities we drew a life size body and added all the organs and their functions! As well as this, we have been looking at how we can best look after our teeth. We even conducted an experiment using eggshells to see which drink would decay it the most!



### Year 5

Happy New Year everyone! Year 5 have had a wonderful start to 2023 and have especially enjoyed starting their swimming lessons. Every Wednesday, we have been walking to Arnos swimming pool and learning how to swim as part of the PE curriculum. It is also great to explore the surrounding area and to observe all the dogs and ducks in the park! In school, we have started our space topic and we have been so impressed with the children's space projects. Well done to everyone who worked so hard on these at home :) In Science lessons, the children used fruits to create their own solar system. We learnt about the order of the planets, the distances between the planets and created rhymes to remember the order. We are very much looking forward to Science week in March!




