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Reception

Year 3

Year 3 have had a fantastic and very busy month of June. We spent many hours practising our class assembly and we had a great time performing it to the school and to our parents. In Maths we have been learning all about shapes, lines and angles as well as solving Egyptian style addition and subtraction worded problems. In Literacy we have been writing an explanation text about the water cycle and in Geography we have been learning to identify the features of rivers.

This has been very exciting as it is Art Week and we have been learning about 'cubism' and recreating our self portraits in the style of Picasso.

We've also performed two fantastic productions, Astra focussing on Egyptian archaeology and Lynx performing the story of Perseus and Medusa. The children did brilliantly to learn their lines and perform to a school audience for the first time since they were in Reception - we were all extremely impressed.

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Year 4

Year 4 have been very busy this month! We have had some lovely trips that have given us lots of lovely memories! We had our very first sleepover at school which was very exciting! We also did a fantastic job at the Barnet Music Festival representing our school!

We have been learning all about electrical circuits and have enjoyed exploring how they work using wired and cells. In English we have been looking at the story Bill's New Frock. We have enjoyed exploring the story and empathizing with how the character feels throughout different stages of the story. Within PSHE, we have been looking at emotions and how we can deal with and manage conflict as our hormones start to change. In History, we have been exploring how the Anglo-Saxons lived and how religion changed in Britain during this Era because of Augustine. Well done for all of your hard work Year 4! (2)

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Year 6

PRIMARY

This month, Year 6 have been busy catching up on a number of projects within their remaining learning time at Primary School. For example, they have successfully tested the trajectory of light beams, by studying shadows under a wide range of variables. They have also designed creative models of transportation, then revised and assembled components of CAM mechanisms in preparation for assembling motorised vehicles. Then on top of those events, the pupils have been studying and trying to mimic the works of artist Sean Thornhill for Art Week - exploring the cohesion of geometric compositions - to bring maths, the science of light and inkwork together!

Outside of the usual curriculum, Year 6 have also done a sterling job of raising more funds in the Summer Fair and a very entertaining car wash! As well as rehearsing their end-of-year show, the children have had more and more exposure to life at secondary school, thanks to the taster sessions provided by the staff at Ashmole Academy. We are so excited, albeit a little sad, to soon be seeing the Year 6 pupils head off onto the next stage in their lives!



Chess Championship

Last Sunday, our chess team flew the flag high for our school, coming 4th out of 64 schools! It was a sensational debut for us and a spectacular experience for us all. For some of us, it was our first chess tournament!

Qualification Tournament 1 - 2nd April 2023

We participated in a online tournament and we all had played phenomenally. Despite the fact that it was a protracted 1.5 hour tournament, we took our chances and bagged joint second with 118 total points out of the top 5. We had qualified for the semi-finals of the CCS Nationals and we all were over the moon. This got us all a silver medal each.

Semi-finals - 14th May 2023

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The spirit was perked since the previous round and we played Maple Walk Primary. It was a rather short round as we only played 2 games each against our paired adversary from both sides of the board. Our chess team had enough wins to carry us to the finals. At this point, we were chuffed with our progress. Since we proceeded to the final, we all attained another silver medal which was slightly larger and more beautiful.

Finals

This was the final tournament of this competition and we had the fire running inside us. Even though we had to miss our final fair at Ashmole Primary, we were determined to contribute to our school with some laurels in chess. This tournament was inperson over the board and we battled till the end. The team comprised of Anson, Vivaan, Andy, Agastya, Ayaz and Eisa - all from Andromeda (Y6). This tournament started with a bang with 4/5 wins in the first round! We had missed out on third eventually by 1.5 points, but as a debut tournament, 4^{th} place was commendable. Since we came fourth, we got a gold medal as we were finalists. The first 3 teams got trophies for their schools and the 4 kids who won the most games in the tournament got £50 each.

Although we didn't bring a trophy back, we came back with a memorable experience and came very close. It was an amazing debut and we played extremely well. We fought till the end, in Ashmole Primary's first ever chess tournament! BREAKFAST AND AFTER SCHOOL CLUB

From September the school will be using a new booking system, SchoolComms, for Breakfast and After-School Club that will enable parents to book their child's place at the club themselves. The bookings for September will go live on 7th July and will close on 19th July.

After the 19th July, parents will no longer be able to cancel their child's place or book any new slots. This will enable the school to book adequate staffing for the club ready in time for September.

Parents will no longer be able to drop off their child on an ad-hoc basis in the mornings. Also, if a child is not collected on time from their classroom at the end of the school day, they will be taken to After-School Club and a late charge of £15 will be applied to their account to cover the cost of extra staffing to accommodate their unplanned attendance.

From September 2023, there will be a slight increase in the pricing structure for our Breakfast and After School Club Therefore, the price of the Breakfast Club will be raised to £6.25 and the After School Club will be increased to £12.50. It is important to note that this is the first price increase since the school's inception in 2016. Bookings can no longer be made via the office, the BASC email address or by telephone.


