Well done for all of your hard work this year, Year 4! We hope you have a lovely summer break and we will miss not having you next year!

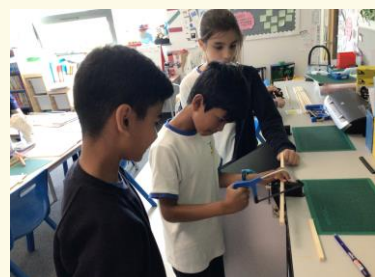
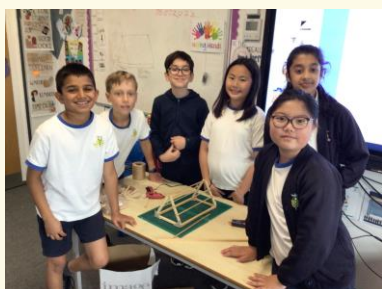

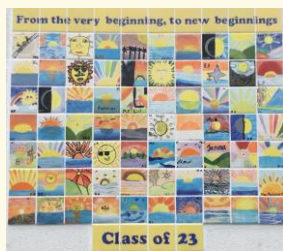
