
# Reception

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# Year 2

What a whirlwind start to the new academic year we've had! We can't believe it's been a month already. We have been so happy with the way all the children have settled in to Year 2 and have been a pleasure to get to know!

We started off the fun with our camp day where we sang camp songs, studied wildlife and roasted marshmallows over the barbecue. The smell of smoke and sweet caramel filled the air in Ashmole Primary.

We have planned and written some beautiful poems about colour and fire to accompany the camp day in Literacy.

In Maths we have been learning about place value and ordering with lots of group investigations.

In Science we have been looking at building materials used today, and how they would have differed from the materials used to build the houses that burnt down during the Great Fire of London in 1666, linking to our History topic.

But the highlight of the month was a visit from White Watch of our local London Fire Brigade! The children loved trying on the fireman's jackets, sitting in the fire truck and having a go using the hose to shoot water!!

We look forward to the month ahead where lots more learning and fun will be had!

## Year 3

Year 3 have been very busy this month. We have been learning all about Greek Myths and we have enjoyed looking at the features of a myth, retelling a myth and creating our own Greek Myth. We have also enjoyed learning about the Ancient Greeks. We have looked at where Greece is on a map and the countries that boarder it, what the terrain of Greece is like and the human and physical features of Greece. We then looked at the events that took place within Ancient Greece and we enjoyed placing them in order on a human timeline and then creating our own timelines within our books. It was very exciting to put all our knowledge into practice when we went to the British Museum to see all the Ancient Greek artefacts!

In Art we have been looking at Greek pots and using images to create and draw our own Greek pot. In Science, we have been labelling the features of plants and learning about the function of each part of a plant. We have been working hard within Maths, looking at the place value of numbers up to hundreds, partitioning numbers in different ways, finding 1, 10 and 100 more and less of a number and using number lines.





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## Year 4

What a fabulous start we have had to Year 4. We are learning all about the Romans and have had some amazing homework shared with us and we had a lesson where we learnt how to march like a Roman Army. In Literacy we wrote our own myths based on the Roman story Romulus and Remus we had great fun acting out our s maps. In Science we have been looking at states of matter and have done some experiments involving melting points of solids including 3 types of chocolate, an experiment that you might want to repeat at home!





## Year 5

Year 5 have settled in brilliantly this month and we have already learned so much! In Literacy, we are really enjoying the book, 'Wonderstruck' which intertwines two stories using words and pictures. This has been the text we have been studying in both Guided Reading and Literacy so we are looking forward to discovering the ending! In Maths, the teachers are so impressed with the children's enthusiasm and passion for the subject, alongside the pride that they take in the presentation of their workings out. We have been learning about place value, addition and subtraction. In PE, we have been choreographing circus dance movements with the coach and identified team building activities with our class teacher. We especially enjoyed working in our teams to balance a pen and to 'cross the river' using hula hoops! Next month, we cannot wait to visit the local church and to start our Christianity learning in RE. Well done for a great start to Year 5! 🙂
