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Reception

This month in Calypso and Orion Class we have been exploring finding one more, one less and addition using different resources such as cubes, teddy bears and numicon. The children have been using the vocabulary related to this and have thoroughly enjoyed investigating what happens to amounts when more is added or some are taken away! We are now exploring 2D and 3D shapes in maths, and the children have been very busy going on shape hunts around the classroom to find objects that are these shapes in our immediate environment. We are almost at the end of learning our phase 2 sounds! We have been incredibly proud of the fantastic progress the children have made in hearing sounds in words and writing these down. We can't wait to continue observing all of their writing over the year and continuing this amazing progress. We have enjoyed celebrating and learning about different festivals this month such as Diwali and bonfire night. The children have been very busy in their play recreating their own imaginative stories and using their newly learned knowledge and their own experiences to direct and influence their play. We really did enjoy having fireworks small world and turning the home corner into a cafe where the children were busy writing menus and making lots of tasty treats!



Year 3

Year 1 have had an exciting November! We have been busy learning all about poems in Literacy. The children enjoyed writing their own witches, wizard and superhero poem. For their 'No pen day' the children loved acting out their superhero poem which is about being friends. Year 1 have also been working exceptionally hard in Maths. They have continued to develop their addition and subtraction knowledge by using bar and part-whole models. In Science, the children have been participating in various scientific experiments to investigate the importance of their five senses. Finally, the children in Year 1 loved participating in this years Barnet Music Festival alongside Year 2. They performed 'Walking on Sunshine' with confidence and excitement. Well done Year 1!



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Year 2

Another amazing month has literally just zipped past! This month we have had a strong musical theme throughout, starting with our trip to the Barnet Infant Music festival at Monkfrith Primary school. The children literally sang their hearts out, and gave an amazing and uplifting performance of 'Walking on Sunshine' in front of three other schools. The children had the whole hall dancing and singing along - well done to all the children for taking part!!!

In Maths, we emphasised the importance of investigations and sought to prove if an odd number always makes an odd number by using systematic and methodical methods. The children were really engaged in this task and proved it does always make an odd number!
