Reception

What a lovely half term we have had in Reception! We had a great time commemorating the King's coronation at the beginning of the month. In Maths, we have been busy exploring, sharing, doubling and counting in 5's and 10's. The children have particularly enjoyed practising the new Maths learning during their choosing time. 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
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Year 4

In Breakfast Club, we sing happy birthday to all children celebrating their birthdays and give them a birthday card and a treat to make their day feel special.





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
