Year 1

Year 1 have had an amazing month this December and have settled into KS1 perfectly this term! They have continued to develop their subtraction skills and have developed knowledge of 3D shapes. Children have explored the shapes in detail exploring vertices, edges and faces. The children have shown great creativity during Art lessons creating some beautiful self-portraits and working together in groups to create portraits while looking at different artistic styles from Van Gogh to Picasso. Year 2

In Literacy we focussed on our persuasive writing. They used emotive language and justified their requests with reasons like real experts.

In Maths we have been covering the topic of money. The children became familiar with the different denominations in coins and notes, and worked on adding up amounts. We even pretended to go shopping at Mr Greens Greengrocers, to see how much a basket of fruit would cost.

In D&T we were tasked with making improvements to the removal vans of The London Removal Company. The children made some incredible "removal vans" which were strong, sturdy and had free flowing axles. The children painted them and they looked great!!

The highlight of the month was our Florence Nightingale WOW day! The children cut vegetables to make a hearty stew for the soldiers in the hospital. They made nurses aprons, sashes and headbands and roleplayed treating the injured soldiers. The children wrapped each other up in bandages (toilet paper!!) to simulate being hurt.

And as if all that wasn't enough, we walked to the Chickenshed theatre to enjoy an inclusive alternative performance of Cinderella. The children loved the interactive elements of the show and had a great time!


