Project Update

Welcome to Dear Neighbour, the monthly newsletter that keeps everyone up to date with progress on the Ashmole Primary school project.

Since returning from the Christmas break works onsite have moved forward at a rapid pace. We have completed the foundation works which involved finishing the preparation work to all the piles, completing all the drainage pop-up works, and completing the ground beam cages. Now that the foundation works to the building are complete we are preparing the ground and laying the reinforcing ready to pour the concrete floor slabs, these will be complete in the next two weeks (please refer to the photograph adjacent). The school ball netting is also being installed and this will prevent any of the pupils or public from retrieving footballs which have been kicked onto the site. We are continuing to recycle as much material on site as possible and to date we are recycling 95% of waste.

On 16 January the site received its first Considerate Constructor Scheme (CCS) site visit. The site presented a positive image with safety, community, corporate and CCS signage displayed and achieved a score of 39 out of 50. We have attached a CCS questionnaire leaflet with this newsletter and ask that all of you complete this form and return it back to site. We value your input and feedback and we will use this questionnaire as an indicator of how we are currently performing and if there are any areas we can improve on.

WINTER NIGHT SHELTER COLLECTION

Between January and March the site team are supporting Enfield Churches Winter Night Shelter drive, managed by the charity All People All Places. The team are collecting food, clothing, and bedding and regularly donating them to St Andrew's Southgate, one of the churches involved in the drive.



The shelter offers a hot meal and a bed for the night to up to 12 homeless people with low support needs who are referred by APAP. Seven churches in Enfield take part in the scheme between January and March.
