Opening Times:

Monday to Friday 7.45am - 8.50am- Breakfast Club £5 per pupil.

Monday to Friday 3.15pm – 5.45pm- After School Club £10. Term time only.

Breakfast will stop being served at 8.30am. There will be up to a maximum of 40 places available for Breakfast and After School Club.

This governor agreement follows parent consultation and balancing the demand for the service and the sustainability of staffing.

Prices remain competitive and reasonable. The costs will also be easier to calculate with the standard payments of £5 and £10 for the clubs respectively which allow parents the flexibility to have their children in the After School Club for the whole session until 5.45pm.

Dear fellow Parents and Carers,

Who is the PTA?

We are Mums and Dad's, just like you who meet up regularly and liaise with the teachers on how we can raise money, and bring our community together.

You're all welcome to join us at our meetings, the first Tuesday of the month, at 7pm in the Academy's training room.

What do we do?

We get together and share ideas for how we can run events, and create a sense of community for the children, parents and staff of Ashmole Primary School. The money we raise goes towards items identified by the teaching staff which will benefit the children.

Events the PTA has run:

- Mothers Day Pop Up Shop
- Happy Bag Recycling
- Coffee mornings
- International Food Day
- Winter Fair
- Face Painting, we have a group of Mums who have been taught how to face paint so they can work their magic on our children at our events.

So far this academic year, we have spent £2010 on reading books, £236 on recorders, and this term we have assigned £2,500.00 for playground activity games and further items required by the teaching staff.

Looking ahead, our big goal is to provide two climbing frames for each of the playgrounds in the permanent building, which could cost up to £10,000 each.

Summer Fair, Saturday 23rd June - we need everyone to volunteer, either in helping with preparations in advance, or on the day. Father's Day Pop Up Shop, Thurs 14th June - in the playground at 0800, and after school until 1700.

Own Clothes Day, Friday 8th June - each child to bring in a jar filled with sweets and tiny toys, in exchange for wearing own clothes. Happy Bag Recycling collection, Thurs 7th June. Bring bags of clothes and shoes to the school.

Coffee morning, Mon 14th May, 9am at Chunk Of Green cafe, Ashfield Parade. We are trying to vary the days of our coffee mornings, and the location so that we can give parents who work, the opportunity to come along. We've held previous coffee mornings on Thursdays and Fridays.

HOW YOU CAN HELP WITH THE SUMMER FAIR?

- Save soft toys or teddies for the summer fair's 'Teddy Shy'
- Save used school uniform for a sale at the summer fair
- Donate a raffle prize worth over £20 or help get a business to donate one
- Advertise your business in our Summer Fair booklet. Prices are £25 per quarter page advert, £35 half page, £50 for full page.
- Would you be happy to have an estate agents board outside your property? Send your class rep address if you haven't already.

Things to know/ other ways to help raise money:

Match funding - most of the major banks, retailers and supermarkets will donate money if it's employees have helped at an event. Does your business do this? We've had £2000 in match funding from Barclays which employs a parent, and an additional company donated £1067 at the request of another parent employee.

Gift aid - if you pay tax, and donate money to the PTA, by completing a gift-aid form, we can get extra money from the tax office.

Grants - some companies offer grants to charities. One parent arranged for £500 to be donated via her company.
