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## Reception News

Calypso Class have enjoyed exploring the concept of 1 less and 1 more. They have been using practical resources to find 1 more and 1 less than a given number. We then moved on to adding larger groups of numbers together. The children grasped the concept well and they were excited to learn some Maths symbols too... +, - and =.

In Phonics we have been using our bodies to help us with using robot voices to sounds out words! We have been jumping as well as using our fingers to count out the sounds we can hear. The children have been working so nicely together in pairs.

Orion class have had a great month in November! We have now learnt all of our phase 2 sounds and we are trying really hard to practise making words and blending our sounds together. We have also been looking at addition and subtraction in Maths and creating number sentences! Orion class have been busy learning our nativity songs and dances and we can't wait to show you them!





## Year 1 News

Nova class have enjoyed learning about deciduous and evergreen trees. We spent some time in the wildlife garden exploring the different leaves and deciding whether they were from deciduous or evergreen trees. Nova class discussed how the deciduous trees and leaves change as the seasons change. Whilst there, we collected leaves and used them for observational drawing, collage and leaf rubbing activities. We had great fun!

In literacy we went on an exciting treasure hunt as a class. We followed the clues which took us around the school until we found the special chocolate coins. Once we had completed the treasure hunt we wrote a recount and explained each part of our adventure.





This month Luna Class have had a fantastic fun-filled month! We took part in a drumming workshop and got to play and sing songs from a different countries in Africa on African drums. To celebrate Black History month, we painted a drip paintings inspired by the artist Frank Bowling. This painting technique is abstract and colourful, we really enjoyed this activity! As part of our Christmas topic in RE, we made Christingles to help us learn more about the celebration of advent and the symbolism of the Christingle.

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## Year 2 News

We have been extremely busy in Carina Class this month. We really enjoyed our African drumming workshop as part of Black History Month and our weekly mindfulness sessions. In our Design and Technology lessons we have been learning about vehicles and axles, and have designed our carts which we can't wait to make next month. In class we have also learnt lots about Mary Secole and Florence Nightingale and are looking forward to our trip to the Florence Nightingale Museum!



In Lyra class this month we have ben working so hard. In Literacy and History we have been learning all about the amazing nurses who paved the way for our nurses today; Florence Nightingale and Mary Seacole. In maths we have covered so many new themes, column subtraction and dividing being our favourites. In division we have covered sharing, grouping and arrays!



# Year 3 News

Lynx class have been super busy this November in Maths and have been learning about mental math strategies for multiplication and division. Lynx then moved onto learning about formal written methods for division and multiplication and we ended the month of November learning about time to be able to identify the correct time on a clock to the nearest 1 and 5-minute intervals.





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Astra Class have been finding out about the cause and effect of earthquakes. In Geography lessons, they have been spending time researching major earthquakes and have started creating their own news reports on the earthquake that shook Japan in 2011.

In class, the children used DIY seismographs to investigate how earthquakes are recorded. They created their own 'earthquakes' using classroom chairs. Some earthquakes were stronger than others and the children saw the effect of this on their seismograph readings. We can't wait to read their final articles next week!

It's been a busy month, and much is going on behind the scenes!

A big thank you to Louise Diakou, Hamideh Afkariedlu and Smitha Reddy for all their help upstairs in the Junior Library, and for their continued help in the downstairs Library.
