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Reception News

With Chinese New Year on the horizon, Calypso Class have been learning all about how it is celebrated across the world. We watched examples of a dragon dance in a parade then made our own dragons! We used the straws to make our dragons move and created some of our own dragon dances too. We have been incorporating real life experiences in all areas of our learning. In Maths we were waiting at our very own bus stop and solved lots of Maths puzzles using the children in our own class as counters to help us remember new and tricky concepts.



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This month Orion class have really enjoyed learning about different types of food in our topic lessons and we had so much fun going to the local green grocers to buy some vegetables. We left the vegetables out in our classroom and observed the changes we noticed when they were left out for a long time. The children have also been trying really hard to apply their phonics knowledge to their writing independently and have been trying to form some addition and subtraction number sentences.

Year 1 News

In Nova class we have continued our topic on animals. This half term we began by learning about nocturnal animals and the special features that they have which help them to hunt at night. We have also looked closely at the body structure of different animals. We have described and compared how different kinds of animals move and which parts of their body they use to help them to do so. In Maths, we have been learning all about money. We have identified different coins, used different coins to pay for a variety of items in our Nova class grocery shop and we have thought of different ways to make the same value. We even learnt how to solve problems involving money.









This month Luna Class have been exploring odd and even numbers. We made structures with cubes to show even numbers have a partner but in odd numbers one cube doesn't. Also, we role-played shops and used coins to pay for items and make the same total in different ways. In Literacy, we have written and performed our own non-sense and descriptive poems! In RE, we learnt about the whispering prayer ceremony in Islam and a lot of us wished for our friends to be compassionate when they are older. We have also enjoyed exploring printing in Art and looking at and comparing houses from the past and present in History.

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Year 2 News

Carina Class have had a busy start to the year! Did you know that in our History and Literacy lessons we have been learning all about dinosaurs? We have looked at artefacts and different sources of information to find out about different types of dinosaurs. We have learnt about where dinosaurs lived; what they ate; and what they were like. We then used the information we gathered to create a non-chronological report for Mr Constantinou, to help him to figure out what type of fossil he found in the nature garden. In D & T we have been learning to make different types of levers so that we can make a class moving dinosaur book for Reception. In Science, we have been 'Apprentice Gardeners'.

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Lyra Class have leapt into the New Year with a fun new topic; Dazzling Dinosaurs. We have been asking questions and researching to write non-chronological reports. Did you know that Mr Constantiou found a fossil in the wildlife garden? We helped him find out more about it.

We've also been learning all about what plants need to grow, we have planted bulbs and are hoping they'll grow so we can plant them in the wildlife garden. We've investigated the best place for a bean to grow too, some of us placed them in the dark cupboard, some in the window in the sunlight, hopefully some of them will germinate soon so we can complete our bean diaries!



<u>Year 3 News</u>

This has been a fantastic month for Year 3! The children came back from the holiday break rested, relaxed and full of energy and motivation for our new topics. We started off the year reminding ourselves of the importance of writing instructions clearly and in the correct order. To ensure that the children were writing instructions correctly, they wrote their own Banana Muffin recipe and tested them out! We had so much fund and the muffins were yummy! In our Computing lessons, the children in Astra class had their first taste of being news/sports reporters. They started to think of questions they could ask each other and created their initial video interviews of each other. In the coming weeks, the children will use the iPads to record sports reports and use software to edit their reports to view in class. We can't wait for the next few weeks!



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In Maths, Lynx Class we have been focusing on place value and measure. The children had the opportunity to use measuring cylinders to measure different volumes of water and explore the capacity of different cylinders. We have also been learning about converting millilitres to litres (vice versa) using our knowledge of place value. We have been learning how to write a set of instructions using bossy (imperative) verbs in Literacy. We wrote a set of instructions to make banana muffins which were super yummy and enjoyed by all Ashmole Primary staff. Well done Lynx and Astral!! Lynx have also been learning about a frog's life cycle and produced high quality explanation texts using lots of imaginative varied vocabulary. What little superstars you all are...
