Reception News

This month Calypso Class have been learning all about different types of food and why it is so important to have a balanced diet. We observed the effects of time on some vegetables and the children were able to spot the differences between fresh vegetables and ones that had been left out over some time. They were very shocked at how bad the vegetables looked and smelt!

We have also enjoyed getting creative with some junk modelling. The children were able to use their problem solving skills in order to decide on the best methods to combine different types of materials and containers. They had fun exploring with

different materials, tapes and glues.







Orion class have really enjoyed learning about different measurements in our maths lessons; they have been using everyday language to compare different weights, lengths and capacities. Our new topic for this term is 'People who help us' and the children have enjoyed being introduced to different occupations and engaging in imaginative role-play based around their experiences.

Year 1

In our Literacy lessons this month, Nova Class have been looking at the story of Oliver's vegetables. We learnt lots about the different vegetables in the story and worked together to retell it in detail using time connectives. Nova class enjoyed taking part in hot seating tasks and then retold the story through roleplay in groups. They all had different roles and loved 'getting into character.' We then wrote our own character description, describing Oliver's appearance and his personality traits.

We have also been learning about measuring length. We explored by measuring using objects found in our classroom and then interlocking cubes, before moving on to using a ruler and reading the increments $oldsymbol{oldsymbol{oldsymbol{D}}}$ carefully. The children worked well using different resources and enjoyed following clear steps when

using a ruler accurately.

In Luna class we have been reading Oliver's Vegetables. We have focused on developing our skills to describe a character. We did this through role play and thinking about Oliver's appearance and personality. We finished the week by writing a character description using interesting adjectives and connectives.

In Maths we have been focusing on measurement. We have enjoyed exploring different ways to measure objects in our classroom. We have used cubes, lollipop sticks and counting bears. We then

progressed onto using a ruler to measure objects and lines.
