

Dear Parents and Carers

As we come to the end of yet another academic year, who could have ever predicted that schools would have been closed for over three months due to a global pandemic! However, the children have continued to amaze me with their dedication, hard work and resilience in what has been a very challenging time for everyone. Throughout the school closure, the staff have continued to work every day, even during the holidays! Each and every one of them has gone above and beyond the call of duty to ensure that all our pupils have been able to continue their learning at home. They have all done an exceptional job and their dedication and commitment to our school has been tremendous. We have received many positive emails and comments from our parents which has meant a lot to all the staff during this difficult time.

I am so pleased that we were able to open our school to all our pupils, even for the last few weeks of term. It is so lovely to see the children back in class with their teachers and friends; I know many of them have missed being in school but I wanted to take this opportunity again to thank all of you for stepping in as teachers, almost overnight! Not all children were able to return to school for various reasons and we look forward to welcoming them back to school in September. Some of them may have anxieties about their return, but please be assured that the staff and especially their teachers are here to support them. In September we welcome our new Reception pupils. Unlike in previous years, the children have been unable to familiarise themselves with their new teachers and their new surroundings, but I am confident that they will settle in just as well as previous cohorts. Many thanks to the PTA for organising the Zoom Welcome Meeting for the new Reception children and their parents.

The government has issued new guidance for schools to open in September to all year groups. Pupils will return to their normal class size of 30. A detailed Head Teacher update letter outlines all our plans for September. This will be constantly monitored and if anything changes, we will let you know. A new risk assessment has been drawn up which has been shared with all the parents and governors before we break up for the summer holidays.

You should have received a copy of your child's End of Year Report. This is a brief report and when we return in the Autumn term, we will be conducting a baseline assessment of all the pupils in reading, writing, maths and science. We also plan to hold Parent Consultations in the Autumn Term.




