Reception

Orion class have had a very busy month in November. In maths, we have really enjoyed using practical resources to help us find 1 more and 1 less than a given number. We have also started looking at adding 2 groups of items together and using the maths symbols to help us write a number sentence! In phonics, we have learnt all of our phase 2 sounds and we have been using our robot voices to help us sound out words. It has been wonderful to see the children forming such lovely friendships and working so well together.

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What an exciting month we have had in Calypso class! At the beginning of the month, we were lucky to have the opportunity to plant some seeds in pots. Everyone enjoyed filling their pots with soil, sprinkling their seeds on top and then singing a song whilst we watered each of them. We can't wait to watch them grow! We also thoroughly enjoyed our Children in Need day, using Pudsey Bear to help us in our maths learning and decorating Pudsey inspired biscuits. In maths, we have been very busy exploring 1 more and 1 less and beginning to look at addition to find the total of two groups. In phonics, we have just finished learning all of our phase 2 sounds and have really enjoyed using our finger sound buttons and jumping in hoops to segment and blend sounds together.

This month we have enjoyed lots of fun and creative activities. We have been learning all about the Christmas story and acting it out in class. We have used what we have learnt during our rehearsals practising for our Christmas Nativity show, which we will record in December. We can't wait for you all to see it! In Nova Class we have also introduced many new mathematical concepts through the use of a variety of resources that support us in our learning. Together we are really enjoying applying our phonetic knowledge when reading and writing and have now begun learning new Phase 5 sounds. All of Nova class have shown a keen interest in our Science lessons where they have been carrying out a variety of experiments.

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Year 1





We have been working very hard this month in Luna Class. In literacy, we went on a treasure hunt around the school. We had to work as a team to read the clues and think about where we had to go next. Eventually, we found the treasure and it was chocolate! We were all so excited. We then wrote an amazing recount of our treasure hunt which included time connectives and verbs. We also had the opportunity to work with the PTA and plant some bulbs in the Wildlife Garden. We all had lots of fun learning about bulbs

and their roots.

In November, Carina Class enjoyed writing their own alternative version of 'Into the Forest' by Anthony Browne using a clear beginning, middle and end and descriptive vocabulary. They also enjoyed helping make a bug hotel in the nature garden, taking part in the 'Road Safety' workshop and taking part in scooter training. In class, they have learnt all about keeping healthy and what is included in a healthy and balanced meal, they have learnt how to use coordinates to find the location of different London landmarks and have begun learning about Florence Nightingale. Carina Class have really impressed their teachers this half term. Keep up the hard work Carina Class!

Lyra have had another lovely month.

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So many fun activities alongside our exciting lessons. We have had scooter training, a road safety workshop and a fantastic art day where we designed house art shields. We've been busy writing stories in literacy and learning column subtraction in maths with a huge focus in handwriting. We can't believe that it's nearly December and will be looking forward to the run up to Christmas.

Year 3

Lynx class have been learning all about the Ancient Greeks in Literacy and have produced some outstanding work. This month we have been learning about how the Ancient Greeks influenced Art and Literature throughout History. In, Science we have been focusing on Light and how shadows are created. The children got to explore with torches and different objects how light and distance effect the size and shape of a shadow.

November has been a lovely month for Astra Class. We have been enjoying the different lessons in class as well as all of the fun activities such as art day where we decorated our house shields with our class. We have been extremely impressed with the knowledge and skill demonstrated when using the laptops. The children have been building on their knowledge of coding during our weekly Computing lessons. They have been using Scratch to create their own animations by giving specific and accurate instructions for their characters. As well as working extremely hard during our lessons, the children have loved exploring and applying their creativity in different ways. We celebrated Diwali by creating our own Rangoli patterns using coloured rice - the results were beautiful! It was lots of fun decorating the pretty, white pebbles for the wildlife garden using different wildlife scenes. We're sure that they will look beautiful!

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<u>Year 4</u>

This month, Cosmo Class have been learning all about volcanoes. We have discussed the Pacific Ring of Fire as well as Mount Vesuvius and how it erupted in 79 AD, burying and preserving Pompeii and Herculaneum in a layer of ash. We have been practising describing the emotions of characters and looking at how people express these feelings with their body language. We had a lot of fun using mirrors to see our facial expressions for different emotions! In Art, we have practised using different techniques to make our drawings look more 3D. In maths, we learnt all about equivalent fractions and used fraction walls to help us compare different fractions. We have learnt a lot this month!

November has been a great month in Apollo Class! The children have come back to school, after half term, very well rested and eager to learn. We've started learning about Volcanoes and even made our own using the techniques by famous artist Margaret Godfrey. We used tissue paper and PVA glue, but not in the way you would think! We stuck our tissue paper down but then went over the top of it with PVA glue too, this gave it a beautiful shine once dry. We know all about how volcanoes are formed and have learnt more about the earth's layers too. During Anti-Bullying week, we used iPads and laptops to conduct some research into animals that work together in teams. After that, we then made our own PowerPoint presentations to deliver what we had found out, to the rest of the class. Well done Apollo class, you have been working extra hard as usual! :)

<u>Art Corner</u>

We had a fantastic time creating our house shields during the Art Day. We had lots of fun and collaborated all together as a school.

I want to say a big thank you to Mr Tofallis, Mr Constantinou, Mr Osman and Mr Wightman for helping to organise and making resources for our shields. They look fabulous and will be displayed in the hall!

Finally, I would like to thank all the parents, volunteers and PTA for all their help and making this day extra fun and special for us all.

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


