

Dear Parents and Carers

It has been fantastic seeing all the children and parents this half term. It has been a very busy and challenging 8 weeks but it has also been a pleasure seeing all the children happy to be back at school and this is what life is all about - trying our best to do all the things that we love to do and returning to some form of normality. We have been able to bring back our Breakfast and After School Club safely and some clubs too such as football and dance. We hope to build on the things we offer even more during the year. Our Reception children will also start Breakfast and After School Club after half term.

The children have all settled back to school very well and our attendance, considering there is a global pandemic, is absolutely amazing at 96.3%! In the event where a class has to be closed for two weeks we will definitely be offering interactive lessons via Zoom and even though we hope that this does not happen too often, we know the reality is that this can easily happen given the current situation in the country. Nevertheless, if we do have to close down a class for two weeks the staff are prepared and ready to continue to deliver online learning for our children. All classes will be informed as soon as possible if this ever has to happen. I am very pleased that the recent Parent Consultations held on Zoom this month went well. The teachers are always willing to speak to the parents and if you ever have any questions or issues always see the class teacher directly. If you cannot catch the teacher for any reason please call to make an appointment with the teacher- after school is normally a better time to speak to them.

In the last few weeks the children have been busy catching up on their learning and teachers have undertaken baseline assessments to help them to plan future lessons and monitor pupil progress for the year ahead. We know that the children have missed school and the teachers have worked hard to create intervention programmes for all the children to help them catch up and build on their overall learning. Our aim as always is to ensure that by the end of the year the children have all made as much progress as possible in all areas.

I wish all our pupils, staff, parents and carers a fantastic half term holiday. We look forward to seeing you all on Monday 2nd November.

I would like to take this opportunity to introduce myself. My name is Amanda Beacon and I am the Music Manager at Ashmole Academy. This is my 9th academic year there! I will now be working at the Primary School one day per week, and will be managing the music instrumental tuition and music extra-curricular activities. I will be working closely with Mrs Toal, who looks after curricular musical activities.

We are very excited that instrumental lessons are beginning again after half term, for years 3 and 4. Lessons will now be on a rotation basis so that your child isn't always out of class at the same time each week. Timetables are on display in the classroom, and will soon be available on Purple Mash. Timetables do change from time to time, so it is worth checking them regularly. (Please note that we will come and collect your child from the classroom for their lessons, so they don't need to worry too much about the times of their lessons).

Please make sure your child brings their music and practice notebook to each lesson, and a pencil! All of our teachers will be wearing the appropriate PPE. We will also ask your child to wash or sanitise their hands before and after their lesson. All keyboards, chairs and music stands will also be wiped down between lessons. As of course you are all aware, extra-curricular activities are very restricted at the moment, particularly with Music. We are currently researching the most up to date guidelines to see if we can begin choir again. We would plan for this to be 'bubble based'. We do have lots of plans for the future once things are a little bit more settled, including lots of collaboration with the Academy.
