Dear Parents and Carers

What a wonderful month we have had, despite the awful weather! The children have enjoyed lots of fun activities, including the Pollution Solution Theatre Workshop on Zoom for pupils in Year 2, Cricket Day for all the children, Year 1 enjoyed a fabulous Victorian Day and Year 2 went back in time to the 1400s to the time of Christopher Columbus - what fun we all had! All the classes have also planted trees in our grounds.

Pupils continue to work extremely hard in the Covid Catch-up programme and our main focus this term

continues to be their well-being and to keep working hard in all areas of the curriculum. The well-being of

the children at Ashmole Primary has always been imperative to our school ethos and this is especially important after such a challenging year for us all. The children have enjoyed a variety of engaging and fun activities each week. We hope this will encourage all of the children to continue to settle back into school through lots of positive and calming activities. I am delighted that we have not reported any positive cases of Covid-19 and that our classes have remained open - thank you to everyone for continuing to wear face coverings whilst on site. This month in Computing, Lynx class have been working together to develop a basic understanding of how emails work, gaining skills using email, being aware of broader issues surrounding email including 'netiquette' and online safety. The children have been working hard on their presentations using Microsoft PowerPoint to create an imaginative presentation on their chosen Egyptian Pharaoh. In Science, Lynx Class have been looking at forces such as pull, push and twist and how different surfaces effect force. The children have also been exploring how different materials are magnetic. Lynx class have had another fabulous month of learning and Mr Osman, Mrs Keshini and Ms Ahmet are so proud of you all and how truly resilient you all are. All equipment and materials for every child will be provided. The masks are sculpted from sustainable Albesia wood grown in community smallholdings which support the local communities in Africa.


