Dear Parents and Carers

Firstly, I would like to begin by saying a huge thank you from myself and on behalf of all the staff for the wonderful gifts and treats at the end of last term. We are always blown away by your generosity and kindness. Thank you!

We have had a positive start to the new year so far, although with the rise in Covid cases, we have needed to take extra precautionary measures by placing some of our classes into 'bubbles'. This has worked really well and we are happy that we have been able to contain the spread of Covid within our school. Reception

We have had a busy month in Calypso class. In Maths, we explored addition and subtraction and enjoyed using resources and writing number sentences. We are now beginning to explore length and have been using our feet, measuring worms, cubes and rulers to find out how long or short an object is. In Phonics, we have been very busy learning lots of new digraphs and tricky words. We have started writing an 'I can see' sentence each morning when we come in to the classroom. Many of us have been trying super hard to form our letters and use our sounds when writing. Well done Calypso Class for having a great start back to the new year!





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Year

Orion Class have had a great start to the new year! In Phonics, we have nearly learnt all of our phase 3 sounds and tricky words. The children are becoming superstars at beginning to use these sounds independently in their reading and their writing. In Maths, we have been looking at addition and subtraction and the children have been writing number sentences independently and using their fingers and a number line to help them find the answer. This term, our topic is 'food'. We have been learning about the different food groups and how to live a healthy lifestyle!

Luna Class have worked exceptionally hard this month in all of our subjects. We have started our new History topic in which we are learning about the Victorian Era and how their homes are different to ours. In Literacy, we have been reading the story Oliver's vegetables and wrote a fantastic character description using lots of adjectives and similes. In Maths, we have been learning about money and had lots of fun setting up our own shop in our classroom. Well done Luna Class, you have all worked so hard and we are very proud of everything you have done this month. Miss Burke, Mrs Keshini, Mrs Davis and Mrs A.





Nova Class have been very busy! In Maths, we have been learning how to use coins to pay for different things and solving problems involving money. During Literacy, Nova have been reading a story about a boy who only wants to eat chips but then tries a variety of vegetables after encouragement from his grandfather. The children wrote their own versions of the story using lots of lovely adjectives, similes and connectives. In History, Nova Class have been learning about the Victorians and comparing their houses to modern ones. Their homes were quite different to ours! The children also really enjoyed using stencils to create patterns during Art. Well done Nova Class!



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January 2022

Year 2

We have had a interesting start to the Spring Term in Carina Class and I hope that things are starting to normalise a little now. The children have coped very well adapting and I am incredibly proud of them. The children have really immersed themselves in our Science (Our Changing World) topic. We explored the Wildlife Garden and discussed how the seasons change the habitat of creatures within it. We then looked in the pond and we saw air bubbles coming from the bottom - we can't wait to see what is living in there! We have grown our broad beans and have hypothesised what will happen to those on the window and those in the dark cupboard.

The children have created some fantastic character writing, and have developed their dictionary and glossary skills.

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Carina Class have developed their Maths skills, understanding data and statistics – they enjoyed applying these skills every day in the classroom. Thank you again to our parents and carers for your ongoing support. Mrs Aliberti and the Carina Class team.



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Lyra Class have had a great start to 2022! We have been enjoying our topic on 'Dazzling Dinosaurs' and have written some brilliant, informative reports about them. We learnt how to research and make notes, then we used these notes to describe the appearance, habitat and diet of different Dinosaurs. We have also enjoyed our Science lessons. In the first week back, we made a visit to the Wildlife Garden where we observed animals and plants, comparing the similarities and differences from Autumn to Winter. The children have used their photography skills to take some great photos of their observations.





Year 3

It has been a great start to the year in Lynx Class. We have just begun reading Stone Age Boy in Literacy, which has helped us develop our descriptive writing and figurative language. We have also been making comparisons between Anthony Browne publications and studying his illustrations too - furthering our ability to use comparative language. Our new History topic, 'The Stone Age', has given us some brilliant opportunities to develop our art work, including making sketchings of Stone Henge and also producing animal portraits using chalk, charcoal and oil pastels. In Maths, we have been developing our multiplication and division skills, learning different strategies to solve problems and taking more of an indepth look at what happens to numbers when we solve calculations. In Music, Lynx Class have been learning to sing Three Little Birds by Bob Marley and also appraising some of his other songs too. Furthermore, we are all looking forward to our trip to the London Islamic Cultural Centre and Mosque next month, which should be a rewarding end to this half term. Finally, I would like to add that it has been a sincere pleasure teaching your children in Lynx Class this half term and I have enjoyed getting to know each and every one of them. They have demonstrated a lot of potential for success in the future! Mr Constantinides 😊

Astra Class have made a fantastic start to 2022! In Literacy we have been making delicious healthy sandwiches and writing instructions. We have been comparing and contrasting books by the famous author and illustrator 'Anthony Browne'. We wrote some fantastic book reviews and also a letter to persuade him to come and visit our school!! This week we started reading 'The Stone Age Boy' book using a range of descriptive language techniques to write setting descriptions. In Maths, we have been developing our multiplication and divisions skills and applying our knowledge through solving problems. In Science, we have been learning about healthy eating and we even designed our own healthy packed lunch as well as learning about different skeletons and their functions and purposes. In Humanities, we have been learning all about the Stone Age and we drew some fantastic cave paintings in Art!!

January 2021

Year 4

This month in History, we have been looking at the Tudors and how the Monarchy influenced the latter centuries. We investigated Tudor England through what has been left behind, looking at artefacts and using the internet to help gather information. We also looked at the Battle of Bosworth and how the War of the Roses influenced the Monarchy. The children also learnt about Henry VIII and his many wives. In our Science topic "Where does all that food go?" the children have really enjoyed the work. We started off by looking at the digestive system and the functions of all the different organs. Then we looked at our teeth and how they help us to digest food and how to keep our teeth healthy. Apollo Class have worked so hard this month and I am super proud of each and every one of them!





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This month in Cosmo Class, we have been extremely busy. We have been looking at our natural environment, identifying the different changes in plants and habitats from Winter to Spring. We looked at how the trees and habitats have changed and the reasons as to why these changes have occurred.

We have also been investigating a Tudor crime scene! We had lots of different artefacts scattered around the room, where we had to identify what we thought the artefact was, what it was made from and what we thought the Tudors used this for. We had lots of fun looking at the different Tudor objects around the room! We have also been looking at adventure stories which we have really enjoyed. We have been thinking about whether Arthur should or should not go on his adventure into the land of the Minimoys and created our own alternative ending to the film Arthur and the Minimoys. We have also been looking at lots of different features that are included within adventure story writing and how adventure stories are structured.

We have also enjoyed exploring different movements and expressions to do with our PE topic, Cats. This term we are exploring the dance, including different movements and expressions that we can incorporate to portray the character of naughty, mischievous and lazy cats. We have been working in partners, peer assessing each other's work, working as a team and in cannon to improve and enhance our dancing skills.

Year 5

Welcome back Vesper Class! This month, we have started our new topic all about space and beyond. The children have enjoyed learning about planets and the stars during Science and used fruit to visualise the vast distances between planets! This term, Year 5 will be attending Arnos Swimming Pool for 10 weeks of swimming and they have made great progress in just 3 weeks! We have enjoyed the weekly walk through the park also. In Literacy, we have focused on a silent movie called 'The Piano' where we learnt how to write a flashback narrative using 'show, not tell' sentences by describing the character's facial expressions and body language. I have been most impressed! In Maths, we are recapping addition, subtraction, multiplication and division using formal written methods. We have even started to practise Year 6 SATs style guestions!

What an exciting start to the new year we've had with our weekly trip to Arnos Pool for swimming lessons. The weather has been cold and bright for our walk across the park every Wednesday morning. The children are doing so well and we are already seeing them improve their skills and their water confidence.

We have started our new Science topic, Earth and Beyond, and have created a fantastic class display where we painted the planets. We had a great lesson where we used fruit to look at the scale of the planets and their distance from the sun. We are looking forward to seeing the homework projects.

We have been working on the Glockenspiels in Music and learning to play along to Bon Jovi's Livin' On a Prayer, Friday morning rocking out in Aquila Class.
