

Message from the Head Teacher Dear Parents and Carers

I hope you all a good rest over the half term. The children have returned to school with a continued enthusiasm for learning, which is pleasing to see.

As you know, the Prime Minister announced the lifting of covid restrictions. However this does not mean that covid has suddenly disappeared; it is a virus that we all need to live with for many years to come. In order to limit the risk of catching and passing on COVID-19, please continue to follow the guidance to: wear a face covering in crowded and enclosed spaces, especially where you come into contact with people you do not usually meet. Pupils with COVID-19 <u>should not attend school while they are infectious</u>. They should take an LFD test from 5 days after their symptoms started (or the day their test was taken if they did not have symptoms) followed by another one the next day. If both these tests results are negative, they should return to school as long as they feel well enough to do so and do not have a temperature. Any child displaying covid symptoms will be sent home, as they would for other illnesses. I would like to take the opportunity to thank you all for your support in keeping our school community safe during the last two years.

We have got a fun packed month in March. Mrs Toal has been working incredibly hard behind the scenes setting up lots of fun and inspirational activities which will take place all this week during Book Week. Parents/carers will be able to purchase books for their children at our Scholastic Book Fair in the Hall, which runs every day throughout the week before school and at the end of the school day. As normal, the week will end with staff and pupils dressing up as their favourite book character - watch this space! Science Week begins week commencing Monday 14th March. Miss Macdonald is also working hard to create lots of fun and exciting activities which will take place in class throughout the week . Again, the week will come to a close with staff and pupils dressing up as a Scientist for the day. Thank you to Mrs Toal and Miss Macdonald for all their hard work.




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Year 2

Year 3

It's grammar week and so the children have been focussed on their spelling, grammar and punctuation skills in literacy.

Finally, our new topic in science is all about forces. The children really enjoyed using the forces of pushing, pulling and twisting on toy cars, plasticine and spinning tops in our experiments. 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Year 4

Apollo class has been doing lots of fabulous learning. In Science, we have been learning about the digestive system and how food is digested in the human body. We have also been learning about our teeth and how they help aid digestion and how we can keep our teeth healthy. Apollo class also learnt about what a healthy diet is and what food chains are. We started the new half term by looking at the positive and negative impact humans are having on the planet. In Literacy, we have been looking at adventure stories and how we can write our own adventure story including lots of different punctuation, feelings and lots of different settings. 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In Cosmo Class, we have been busy completing our PE topic Cats. We used what we had learnt throughout our PE topic to create a final performance. We then have a chance to perform our dance sequences to our partners and peer assess each other's work. In maths we have been busy learning our times tables. We have also been looking at different positions and directions, which included moving and placing co-ordinates on a grid.

In Science, we have enjoyed learning about our digestive system and where all our food goes. We looked at different food chains, the purpose of different organs and teeth within digestion, as well as how we can keep our teeth healthy. Well done for all your hard work Cosmo Class!

Year 5

Another busy few weeks for Aquila, everyone is making such great progress with their swimming. We are so proud of how confident you are getting.

We have been working hard on our art unit, focussing on the work of Peter Thorpe. We have designed and decided on our style, painted the background in an abstract style and added the rocket detail to the foreground.

We have been looking at stories from other cultures over the past few weeks too and have written some beautiful pieces of work focussing on figurative language. We had a great drama session where we created a conscience alley based in the story of Mufaro's Beautiful Daughters.

Before half term, we started our Space topic and the children thoroughly enjoyed creating space art in the style of abstract artist, Peter Thorpe. We worked on backgrounds and foregrounds using a variety of materials such as paints, oil pastels and colouring pencils. Isla in Year 4 Cosmo Class has been learning Recorder at school as well as Piano.

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
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She recently passed both of her ABRSM exams with Distinction; grade 4 piano and grade 3 recorder. Well done Isla, what a fantastic achievement.

Drop off and Pick up


