Welcome back after the Easter break; I hope you were able to get some rest and that the children are looking forward to a busy summer term. With the anticipation of sunny days ahead, the summer term is always filled with excitement. The children have so much to look forward to this half term ending in a Platinum Jubilee Celebration Day to commemorate Her Majesty the Queen's 70 year reign.

After a turbulent couple of years, KS1 SATS are back! Pupils in Year 2 are working incredibly hard practising, with the final assessments taking place throughout May. Thank you to all our parents and carers for your support during this time.

Thank you to everyone that managed to see their child's class teacher during the recent parent consultations and for completing the parent comment forms. Your feedback is very important to us and I am pleased to say that all comment forms that were received have been extremely positive. If you missed your appointment, or were unable to attend for any reason, please speak to your child's class teacher.

This year, Ashmole Primary School received one of the highest number of applications in Barnet with 375 people applying for a Reception school place for September 2022. Our team of dedicated staff make our school a popular choice for families of young children within the local area.

Can you believe that our school will be full from September 2022. As you know the school opened in September 2016 to it's very first cohort of just 60 pupils. We were housed in porta-cabins for the first two years, but the children had fun and worked incredibly hard. I am so proud of everything that we have all worked so hard to achieve since the school's infancy - long may it continue. My proudest moment was definitely achieving our 'Outstanding' status by Ofsted in May 2019. Our 'Outstanding' status is never taken for granted and everyone continues to work at this level.

Have you noticed our Kindness wall in the playground? Isn't it fantastic? Thank you so much to Kayt, Leyla, Andria and Liudmila for creating this amazing piece of art work. It definitely is a statement piece of art and rightly so! We at Ashmole Primary all agree that Kindness definitely wins! We are incredibly lucky to have so many amazingly talented parents. During the recent parent consultations, I hope that you also managed to see the incredible murals on the KS2 stairwells as well as the history timeline along the KS1 corridor - thank you to Lauren for her fantastic work. You are all incredible!

Year 3



After just a few days the children already know that the Ancient Egyptians built over 120 pyramids and they believed in over 1,400 gods!!

Our RE topic is on the Torah and how Jewish stories provide valuable life lessons. The

They've also been working on their Kenning poems in Literacy, which are pairs of words used in a poem to describe something of interest.

Astra Class have had a great start back to the summer term after a lovely Easter break. The children have enjoyed catching up and sharing stories about their holidays. This week we visited the Wildlife Garden and observed the changes that occur in the different seasons. The children did some great sketches and made some good observations. The children are very excited about learning the Ukulele and they have also enjoyed singing and performing their musical talents on different instruments. We are looking forward to starting our new topic about the Ancient Egyptians and also designing and printing hieroglyphs in Art.

Over the next few weeks we will be learning about how to write mystery stories and we will be reading Marcy and the Riddle of the Sphinx. We will be learning more about fractions in Maths such as how to recognise equivalent fractions as well as adding and subtracting fractions. In RE we will be learning all about the Jewish religion and we are hoping to visit a local synagogue. In science we will be 'rock detectives' when we will be investigating and learning about different rocks, their properties and uses.

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## Year 4

Year 4 visited Hampton Court Palace and took part in the Exploring Tudor Kitchen workshop. The children learned about the Tudors during their visit and how Henry the IIIV kitchens were run and understood the role of the different Tudor kitchen departments, and of those working there, through examining fabrics and furnishing. They also investigated what the Tudor kitchens tell us about life at Henry VIII's court which helped the children draw conclusions about what it was like to work in a Tudor kitchen and make comparisons with their own lives. The workshop helped the children develop a chronological understanding beyond 1066 and has given the children an understanding of methods of historical enquiry and how evidence is used to make historical claims.





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We had a lovely time at our Hampton Court trip before half term! It has been lovely to be back in school after the Easter holidays. In Cosmo Class, we have been looking at riddle poetry and we have been enjoying writing our own riddles. We are excited to learn more facts and information about the Anglo-Saxons as well as learning about vibrations and how we hear within Science. We are also looking forward to being creative within our Art and D&T lessons. We are all really excited to represent Ashmole Primary school at the music concert in June and some more school trips this term. (2)

### Year 5

Welcome back Year 5! We hope you all had a lovely and relaxing Easter break. We have had a great start to our summer term and enjoyed our daily mile run around the school. The children ran 5 laps around the school and practised different running techniques. As part of their PE athletics topic, they have learnt how to sprint and what makes an excellent sprinter through strides and using their arms to help. In Literacy, we are focusing on Cressida Cowell's 'How to Train Your Dragon' and this week they have created their own dragons and written recounts of the story so far. Going forward, we will be writing setting and character descriptions. In maths, we are revisiting place value and the four main operations- addition, subtraction, multiplication and division. We will be applying learnt techniques to reasoning questions and word problems and even start to attempt SATs style questions! Our overdl topic this half term will be the Vicious Vikings and we will be looking at the importance of the Viking civilisation and how their invasion impacted the lives of Anglo Saxons in Great Britain and the things they left behind which still influence our lives today. We know we will enjoy this topic and look forward to learning lots!





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
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# Thank You!
